From the Pastor's Pen –

Advent -Christmas 2009 “For Those Who Wait”

Every stage of our life involves some form of waiting. When our children are tiny, we wait years for a good night's sleep. When they're teenagers, we wait what seems like years, for them to return safely home after a night out.

We wait for the right job (or any job), for the right relationship, for the right leader, for the right time ...

We wait for children, grandchildren, for surgery, for retirement ... and we wait for the results of medical tests.

Waiting can present an enormous challenge. We tend to be impatient, I-can-fix-it kinds of people ...

but not all situations can be fixed. We assume that everything in life can be made better by taking action, but sometimes it just isn't so.

The season of advent, more than any other time of the church year, invites us to embrace the spiritual discipline of waiting. For this season will not be rushed. The advent carols must be sung. The Advent candles must be lighted week by week. Christmas will finally come when all the expectant scriptures have been read and when the baby has finally been born.*

We may deplore the passivity of waiting. Yet waiting is an enormous opportunity if we

regard it as a wise teacher. Waiting offers us spiritual gifts: the gift of patience; the gift of letting go; the gift of living in the present; the gift of trust in God; and the gift of gratitude, among many gifts.

And so this Advent-Christmas season, let us welcome *waiting* as a spiritual discipline, and join the poets in praying,

God, be with us in our waiting ...

God's abundant grace and peace be with you,

Advent is the season of anticipation, the season of
waiting, Have you ever considered the spiritual gifts that
we can claim from waiting? During this Advent season,
we explore five distinct spiritual gifts of waiting. The

• **Saturday, December 12**

• **Sunday, December 13**

will again be joining us during worship, bringing their

Christmas. Immediately following the benediction, this
talented group of students will continue sharing their gift
in a mini-concert. Then stay and enjoy holiday goodies
as you meet these amazing young people and their
families.

• **Sunday, December 20**

4:00 pm Meet at the church, then join the fun as we
take the Christmas season in music to those who are
homebound. We will end up at Cyndy Reames’ home,
69 Lackawanna Blvd in Gillette, for a potluck party,
more music, laughter, and fun. A sign-up sheet is in the
PCN notebook on the sanctuary piano.

- **Thursday, December 24, Christmas Eve**
5:30 pm Before all the family gatherings and opening of presents, join us for a time of worship, including a service of communion and a traditional candlelight singing of Silent Night. Tim Walton, director of the Franklin High School Gospel Choir, will share his gift of music as part of the service.

- **Sunday, December 27**
10:30 am Creches, Carols, and Cookies is the “theme” for worship on this first Sunday after Christmas. Everyone is invited to bring a crèche (nativity scene) to be displayed on specially prepared tables in the choir loft. Notes from the Covenant Board

The following are highlights from the October 20, 2009 stated meeting of the Covenant Board.

- A motion was passed to approve that TUC become a member of “More Light Presbyterians” adopting the following statement: “Following the risen Christ, and seeking to make the Church a true community of hospitality, the mission of More Light Presbyterians is to work for the full participation of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people of faith in the life, ministry and witness of the Presbyterian Church (USA).”
- A motion was passed to approve that 3% of the monies allotted in the 2009 budget for the PCUSA and the UCC Benevolence funds be paid now; the other 3% to be paid at the end of the calendar year.
- A motion was passed to hold a special congregational meeting at noon on December 6 to discuss the future of TUC and the possibility of getting a building loan to improve and expand our present facility.
- A motion was made and passed to accept the report from Treasurer, Peg Mara.
- A motion was made and passed to hold the next stated meeting of the Covenant Board on Thursday, Nov. 19 at 7 pm.
- A motion was made and passed to elect Lynn Merrill as elder representative to the Nov. 17 meeting of the Elizabeth Presbytery.
- Discussion of the 2009 Stewardship Campaign: *Building a Vision; Leaving a Legacy.*

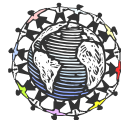


The "construction crew" – Robbyn Prange and Thom Rhodes – continue to make changes to the TUC website. Take a look at www.trinityunitedchurch.org.

OUTWARD BOUND ~ MISSION at TUC

Our annual Christmas offering, collected on Dec. 20 and Dec. 24, will be divided between the two denominations.

Ongoing Mission Opportunities:

Each Christmas season the Mission Team provides opportunities to give to those who have less than we have, to share our gifts. This year, we will collect *new* gifts for adults and children for the **Elizabethport Center**. The center takes our gifts and makes them available for a small price to those in Elizabeth so that they can give and receive presents on Christmas. Elizabethport was started by our Presbytery as a small mission project and now represents a major social institution in Elizabeth.

We will also be collecting *new toys* for the **Somerset County Jail Chaplaincy**. The chaplains at the jail make these toys available to prisoners to give to their children. Toys/gifts for babies and teenagers are especially needed.

TUC's outreach to the world will once again, be monetary gifts for **Heifer International**. We will have

gift cards from Heifer for you to give to your recipients. Giving the gift cards, indicating that you have “given a sheep” (or some other animal), offers an opportunity to talk about how Heifer will give the actual sheep to a family who will then raise it for wool to sell and meat to eat. Then, when they have baby sheep they must pass on the gift to another family in the village, keeping the cycle going.

The bins for the gifts to **Elizabethport Center** and the **Somerset County Jail Chaplaincy** are in the sanctuary. Checks to **Heifer** should be earmarked “Heifer.” **All Gifts will be delivered in the first week of December. Heifer gifts will be collected through the end of December.**

FOOD BANK NEWS



The next **Hunger Offering** will be collected on **Sunday, December 20, 2009**. Bring your donations of food-stuffs such as stews, soups, tuna, pastas and sauces, rice, cereal, vegetables and fruit, peanut butter, canned meat, and powdered milk, to bring forward during the worship service. Or, drop off your contributions of cash or food to the church anytime during the month. The basket is always kept in the narthex (the little entry way off the sanctuary). Remember, the Food Bank Network of Somerset County can purchase 10 times the amount of food per dollar that we can as individuals.

Continued thanks go to Ernie Cottrill and Joanna Marston for delivering our food donations to the Food Bank distribution center and to Paul Krueger, for the volunteering he does each week at the center.
